
Making Places

Linda Fleming and Michael Moore


July 12 - September 22, 2013

Linda Fleming and **Michael Moore** have been married for decades; their life together is a pastiche of homes built, places cultivated, practices evolved, dogs loved, friends lost, meals shared, and first-and-foremost, art produced. The exhibition features custom-made spaces, collected objects, designed audience experiences, as well as the couple's remarkable paintings, drawings and sculptures.

Linda Fleming's drawings and sculptures create places of shadow and light. She has exhibited widely throughout the United States and her works are in international collections in Moscow, Russia; Bagdad, Iraq; Sydney, Australia; and Seoul, Korea as well as the U.S. Her public installations include: the International Quilt Study Center, Lincoln, Nebraska; the Berkeley Art Museum; Oakland Museum; Cantor Museum of Art, Stanford University; and Nevada Museum of Art. Fleming's work has been reviewed in numerous periodicals including: Art in America, Sculpture magazine, and the New York Times. Currently, she is a Professor of Fine Arts in Sculpture and Graduate Studies at California College of the Arts in San Francisco. Fleming was honored as CCA's Distinguished Faculty and has been awarded grants by the Pollock-Krasner Foundation, the Adolph and Esther Gottlieb Foundation, Art Matters, and the Athena Foundation.

Michael S. Moore was born in Los Angeles California and drew from an early age. He graduated from Stanford University and left the Yale MFA program after a year to paint, showing frequently around the Bay Area, Los Angeles and beyond. His works are in many private collections as well as numerous corporate collections and institutions such as Stanford University, Mills College, OMCA, SFMOMA, the Oats Park Art Center in Fallon, Nevada, and others.



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
